September Meeting

The September meeting/activity will be Saturday September 23rd and will be an "Aircraft Weight & Balance Clinic". If you have an aircraft that you would like to have checked, please contact one of the chapter officers with the following information: Aircraft Make & Model – for example Piper PA28-140. This information will allow us to gather aircraft datum information ahead of time.

In addition, plan to arrive at the hangar with full fuel tanks (self serve pumps are nearby) and a "cleaned out" cabin. Normally, weighing is done with empty tanks to establish the empty weight, but the logistics of draing tanks and then refilling after weighing precludes this. We will "back-calculate" to determine empty weight.

The weigh-in location is the 4th hangar south of the self service pump on the west side of the taxiway.

August Meeting

The August meeting was a fly-out to Marion, IL (MWA) to view the solar eclipse. Due to several last minute issues, only two planes were able to make the flight, but it was well worth it. The airport did a nice job handling the arrival of about 130 aircraft (including 35 corporate jets) for the day. The airport was near the centerline of the 100% eclipse track.
