EAA 729 Elections

Each year, we hold elections for open seats on Board of Directors, which have 2 year terms. Any member "in good standing" with EAA 729 can put forward their name (think dues paid). This includes current board members with expiring terms and those classified as "student members".

EAA 729 By-Laws has three classification of Directors: **Class I** which is comprised of appointed officer positions; **Class II** whom are elected during even years; and **Class III** whom are elected during odd years. Our By-Laws also stipulate that a minimum of 6 Directors will be seated for a functioning organization. We currently stand with seven BoD's.

With 2021 being an odd year, we have 4 Director seats coming up for election. Those Directors with expiring terms are Larry Morlock, Bob Butterfield, Brad Moore and Brad Stinebring. After 25+ years, Larry Morlock has decided to step away from the BoD's and David Lynch with 25+ years is stepping off the BoD, as well, though his term expires year-end 2022. We will have four open seats and one seat to be filled by appointment.

If you are interested in participating in the work of the Board, please submit your name by Sunday, December 12th. On Monday, December 13th, we will be sending out a ballot to each 729 member "in good standing" listing candidates whom raised their hand. At January BoD meeting (1st Thursday of each month)... **Class I** officer roles will be nominated and elected internally by the BoD's.
